A week ago I started 4 months' leave - a combination of a month of holiday and 3 months' sabbatical time. My plan has been to spend much of my sabbatical time travelling the prairies and visiting rural congregations that are flourishing or thriving.

By thriving or flourishing, I mean congregations that:

- have a consistent or growing membership (in the rural context, that doesn't necessarily mean a large membership), and that the membership is reflective of the community context
- are financially stable
- engaged with the community in meaningful ways (town, region, and wider world)
- offer worship that engages and inspires
- offer a variety of educational opportunities
- is engaged in a variety of missional/outreach endeavours

Interspersed with the visiting, I'll be seeking ways that what I learn may be applied to our context, here in south-central Alberta. I hope to create some form of log of my learnings, that I can share with other congregations.

Another piece of my sabbatical journey will be to spend time with the grief that entered my life in June, with the sudden passing of my mom. Our family's world changed on June 23rd, the day after my parent's 66th anniversary. I will also be spending time with my dad, as I am now sharing the role of his primary care with one of my sisters. Dad lives in a wonderful seniors' residence in southwest Calgary, with amazing caregivers and support, however dementia and health challenges only serve to compound the sense of deep loss he is experiencing, after losing the true love of his life.
